

Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children

The Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC) is a uniform binding and enforceable contract between two states when a child has the approval to be placed with a family or facility in another state. The ICPC includes referrals on parents, relatives, foster parents, adoptive parents, and residential treatment facilities. The ICPC ensures protection and services to children who are placed across state lines.

Persons who can initiate ICPC referrals are private parties, courts, attorneys, and private and public child welfare agencies.

Per ICPC Regulation 4, admission for treatment of an acute condition includes the treatment and care of minors who are mentally ill, emotionally ill, or developmentally disabled and require treatment beyond what was required for stabilization of the underlying acute condition. Any placement of a minor for treatment of that minor's chronic mental or behavioral condition into a facility having treatment programs for acute and chronic conditions must be made pursuant to the Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children.
